HumanKind (formerly Presbyterian Homes and Family Services) offers homes in Lynchburg for adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities. Group homes provide congregate living arrangements to a small group of adults with recognized developmental disabilities. Consumers receive primary care, which is comprised of

a room, board, and general supervision. In addition, they receive assistance training, and specialized supervision according to their individual support needs and preferences. Each resident is encouraged to be as independent as possible with daily living activities, hopefully, to achieve an improved quality of life through integration in community activities.

The home has a spacious kitchen and dining area and living room. Residents either work or attend a day program and many participate in Special Olympics teams. All have active social lives. Van service is provided for the residents of the home.
