Case managers collaborate with other staff including psychiatrists, nurses, therapists, other qualified professionals and community partners. Case managers partner with other agencies such as schools, primary care physicians, specialists, the Department of Social Services, the Social Security Administration, etc. to help individuals receive the appropriate services to meet their specific needs.
